

## Built to Last—A Legacy Entrusted to Us



Our lives have been blessed by the fraternal legacy we have inherited in the form of the Masonic Fraternity and its family of related organizations. Our Lakewood Masonic Family has also been blessed by the physical legacy that we know as our Lakewood Masonic Temple.

Just as Freemasonry was designed and built to withstand the test of history, our Lakewood Masonic Temple was designed and built to last. Beneath its Bedford limestone skin are hidden a

steel skeleton, concrete floor decks and brick and clay tile walls. The concrete roof deck is skinned with clay roof tiles. Buildings of this nature have stood for centuries rather than decades—but only if properly maintained.

In recent years we have successfully assembled the necessary funds to replace many of the elements of our building that, by their nature, have lives measured only in decades. As a result we now have relatively new ele-

ments such as copper rain gutters, copper chimney flashing, boiler, radiator vents and traps and portions of our electrical and plumbing systems; and our topmost exterior masonry has been repointed.

But we still have significant projects ahead of us, and the continued support of our members and friends, especially in these difficult economic times, will be critical to our success.

We have an opportunity to secure a government grant to partially fund our two most critical exterior rehabilitation projects; namely, replacing our Lodge Room Balcony level windows and repointing the balance of our exterior masonry. If we can assemble \$45,000 we will be eligible for \$30,000 in matching funds. The total will largely cover these two critical needs.

#### **Funding Our New Masonic Scholarship**

#### LakewoodAlive Partnership

Our Lakewood Masonic Temple has become a formal in-kind partner of LakewoodAlive, whose mission is to promote Downtown Lakewood in particular and the Lakewood community in general.

LakewoodAlive was founded in 2003 as a nonpartisan membership organization seeking to inform and engage citizens about economic development opportunities and activities. Its primary activities include community forums on such topics as housing, city finances, arts and culture and economic development.

LakewoodAlive recently merged with Lakewood Community Progress, Inc. (LCPI), the parent organization of the volunteer-based program Main Street Lakewood. LCPI was founded in 2002 as an economic development corporation jointly sponsored by the Lakewood Chamber of Commerce and the City of Lakewood. LCPI's mission is to improve the quality of life of Lakewood residents by creating alliances with community leaders, leveraging community assets and expanding the pool of community resources to facilitate economic stability and growth.

The new LakewoodAlive is a natural fit and combines the best of its predecessors. Our Lakewood Masonic Temple is a major western anchor of Downtown Lakewood and is a valued venue for community events such as Light Up Lakewood, an event to kick off the holiday season; Walk+Roll Lakewood, a summer event promoting healthy pursuits such as walking and bicycle riding; and the Lakewood Arts Festival. Our facility serves as a welcome rest area and performance venue. Our partnership also benefits our Lakewood Masonic Family by linking us with visitors who may become future renters or members.

#### Relief

One of the three principal tenets of a Freemason's profession, and thus defined in the lecture of the First Degree:

To relieve the distressed is a duty incumbent on all men, but particularly on Freemasons, who are linked together by an indissoluble chain of sincere affection. To soothe the unhappy, to sympathize with their misfortunes, to compassionate their miseries, and to restore peace to their troubled minds, is the great aim we have in view. On this basis, we form our friendships and establish our connections.

Of the three tenets of a Freemason's profession, which are Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth, it may be said that *Truth* is the Column of Wisdom, whose rays penetrate and enlighten the inmost recesses of our Lodge; *Brotherly Love*, the Column of Strength, which binds us as one family in the indissoluble bond of fraternal affection; and *Relief*, the Column of Beauty, who ornaments, more precious than the lilies and pomegranates that adorned the pillars of the porch, are the widow's tear of joy and the orphan's prayer of gratitude.

## Homecoming and Memorial Service Held at the Cleveland Christian Home

On Saturday, October 4, 2008, the Sir Knights of the Seventh Division participated in the Homecoming and Memorial Service held at the Cleveland Christian Home. The event was a Homecoming and Memorial Service for Anna "Mom" Thorpe. Anna Thorpe was an orphan herself and arrived at the home at the age of 16 from Oklahoma. At the time of her arrival, the children at the home had a diet of cottage cheese and prunes, and denim clothing was what they wore. Mrs. Thorpe vowed that if she had the power, she would change this and provide better for the children. She eventually took over the running of the Home and kept her word to the children. She ran the home for approximately 43 years. She married, and after retirement her husband and she moved to Michigan. They resided there until their deaths. Their ashes have been returned to the Home and are to be interned in a Memorial Garden dedicated to their memory.

The Sir Knights in 1925 raised and donated enough money to build and furnish the Babies Wing of the Cleveland Christian Home (which was a large sum of money for this period). These Commanderies included Oriental #12, Holyrood #32, Forest City #40, Coeur de Lion #64, Holy Grail #70, Allenby #73 and Heights #76 (which is now part of Coeur de Lion #64). The interaction between the Sir Knights and the boys at the home was so long lasting that when they had grown into manhood they became Masons and then Sir Knights as a way of paying back some of what the Fraternity had given them when they were youths.
